## **Update on the Grinnell Community Meal**

Beginning in October 2023 our church started hosting the Grinnell Community Meal, a weekly free community meal dedicated to providing fresh, nutritious meals to members of the Grinnell community. The Meal is the result of a merger of the Davis Community Meal, a non-denominational, community-run meal, and our Blessed Community Meal, that was restarted in the Spring of 2023. The Grinnell Community Meal maintains the nonsectarian character of the Davis Community Meal along with its strong network of support from various community groups, and uses the kitchen provided by our church. The weekly meals are not restricted to any religious group, and everyone is welcome. The Meal's main purpose is to be a food resource for food-insecure members of the community; it is also a source of community engagement and fellowship.

Over the past few months, the Grinnell Community Meal has seen a regular attendance of around 45-60 individuals and has attracted a variety of volunteers. Volunteers from GUMC, several other churches, civic groups, non-profit organizations, and businesses have provided and served the meal. The majority of the meals are prepared in the church's kitchen and the weekly attendance includes 8-15 volunteers who cook, serve and cleanup. The largest number of attendees are senior citizens. Some are GUMC members, although most are not. Our goals are to serve 80 or more each week, to reach more families with children and involve more community groups in the project. \$500 toward a youth group mission trip \$1,600 toward confirmation camp for kids


\$2,100 toward the TGIW (Thank God It's Wednesday) program, this was an after school program sponsored with the Lutheran Church

# **February Church Council Minutes**

GUMC Church Council Meeting March 24, 2024
Attendees - Ginny Cameron, Jerry Lane, Ramona Mitchell, Gary Porter, Pastor Eric Schubert, Connie Scurr, Scott Sharp, Mindy Tokle, and Carolyn Grosenbach Mindy Tokle -brought meeting to order at 7:05pm. Pastor Eric discussed his friend that just did sermon on Forgiving God - he might ask for notes on that, he would like to use it here at some point. This Sunday "Vulnerability" will be topic of sermon. Getting to know each other - Easter growing up. Devotion given by Jerry Lane: "Don't Abandon Me" - cry from David Prayers and concerns

Approval of February minutes - no changes to make

Pastor's Report/Comments- Pastor Eric reported that we are working on getting things set up so overflow can be used in that way again, he believes that we have worked a way to put bells in front of sanctuary when they play. Craig Shore is looking into options for changes to improve speaker system in overflow. The first Sunday in May will be Confirmation Sunday. Renewal Leave will be May 6th-June 2nd. Pastor Eric is working to make sure everything is ready to go and that everything happens that is on the schedule. He has sermon series planned out through summer and knows what he will be doing this fall. Phone system discussed as Jerry Lane asked how it is working. He had trouble having people getting back to him. Pastor Eric says app works well and when calls are returned it appears as he is calling from office.

Finance: Jerry Lane - Annual audits are completed.

They are getting ready to give the congregation the first quarter report of church finances as follows:

Actual Budget %

Total revenue W/O restricted income \$169,852.21 \$502,766.00 33.78% Total expenses W/O restricted expenses \$116,221.59 \$502,766.00 23%

Net revenue W/O restricted accounts \$ 53,631.16

Pledge data 11 pledges are up to date (12%); 60 pledges are ahead in their giving (66%)- an additional \$57,468.00; 20 pledges are behind in their giving (\$22%)-a decrease of \$7,960.00 The Finance Committee wants to keep finance figures more up to date during year for congregation; Church Council members present agreed the above would be workable.

Memorial: Don Burkhead - The Memorial Committee met February 22nd and defined 2024 goals. Don sent following report as unable to attend meeting: The Memorial Committee approved using memorial funds to purchase repairs for the Park Street ADA entrance automatic door opener (thank you Gary for fixing!). Memorial funds were also approved to purchase items for new WiFi notification service addressing building safety concerns (3 water leak temperature sensors; 6 smoke alarm alerts; 1 armed intruder alert). We also received a request for funds to purchase new speakers and associated wiring for the

**Foundation:** Ramona Mitchell - Foundation committee reviewed end of year financials and the funds held in the Foundation accounts. There were no expenses so far in 2024. We will invest in some new AI stock after discussion with Edward Jones representatives.

overflow area to enhance audio for expanded seating.

**SPRC:** Pastor Eric said they reviewed Personnel Handbook - making sure up to date. They may be increasing Amy's hours, going to go back to 40 hours total. While there was a job share for the position it was 30 + 10.

**Trustees:** Gary Porter - Gary asked about cleaning carpet and if it would be part of Trustee Budget. Jerry said he would check with Amy.

He is thinking about hiring Uni-First, which is a company that would swap out the rugs in front of the Park Street and Office entrance on a monthly basis. The registers in dining area need to be replaced; Gregg Hawkins tried to clean them. Gary asked if committee okay with white and we agreed; he will replace with white as was their first choice. Because we want protection over night-time hours a smoke/fire detection system is to be installed. Church Mutual device hears Smoke Alarm; hopefully someone else besides Pastor Eric would get call too. Gary said he feels members of committee all bring special skills. Scott German is working with Delphina about ovens; we might get funds to help with expense from 100 People Who Care, or maybe Greater Poweshiek Foundation will get involved. Jeanette serves as secretary to committee. Painting ready to start in entryway - discussed needing to find volunteers. Entryway has been freshened up; thanks to committee member Sally, and also Cindy and Amy. Gary said possibly Eric Bailey and he would help pull wires for improving sound in overflow area if needed. Jerry said there is now Wireless System.

Connections: Scott Sharp - The Welcome Center table is up, running and staffed after each service. So far, we have given away 7 tumblers to visitors. The order for tumblers purchased by congregational members will be finalized soon. Additional orders will be taken as interest dictates. The March 17 potluck was attended by approximately 70 persons. Fellowship and food were great, and the event was very well received. Thank you to everyone who participated and helped clean up! The next order of business for committee is the Confirmation Breakfast on May 5th. He asked advice of time for breakfast -9:15 was decision. Scott also asked who to receive them. There was discussion about Care Packages. Scott said they will touch base with Connie Scurr about what we used to do for Grinnell College students around Finals time; we quit at Pandemic. Chris Bair says okay to do this again. Bobbye has list of all the people that are connected with our church; now 15 are involved per Pastor Eric. Mindy remembered used to be around 20 Care Packages. Chaplain position at Grinnell College is now filled.

**Discipleship:** Andy Hamilton sent report: gave a verbal update at the last meeting that we are looking at Pastor Eric's data to see where connections are being made and to determine interest.

Service: Ginny Cameron reported that Earth Day will be April 28th. This also will be Take Away Hunger Sunday so probably will do both in south part of Fellowship Center. Fellowship Time will move to Wesley Room and MASS Class to the Chapel. Ginny also advised us that Paul Stransky is no longer at Africa University Farm so we haven't gotten any updates. Amy is trying to help her find someone that can get us information. Woodamar - Doctor & wife were going to retire in 6 months but now at another hospital. It seems as if he was hoping funds donated would get transferred to this new facility and is working to try to make the connections. We have lost our missionaries at both Africa University Farm and the Mutambara Hospital, due to retirement and a move. Any has been helping us find new contacts. Amy is great resource in helping to find out info for the committee.

Worship: Tim Niswander - sent email - The committee did not meet this month.

UWF: Pam Kinnaird was not present. Carolyn Grosenbach reported that two circles don't meet in January and February but Dorcas Circle does. Pastor Eric let us know the musical at Grinnell High School is in the evening of April 20th; Anna Schubert is a part of that. He also reported our church will be hosting the Luther College Choir on April 20th; Rachel Circle will be providing a noon meal and the concert will be held in the afternoon. There was a change in time because of the musical at GHS. Pastor Eric said his sermon on April 7th will be talking about General
