<u>Update on the Grinnell Community Meal</u> Beginning in October 2023 our church started hosting the Grinnell Community

Meal, a weekly free community meal dedicated to providing fresh, nutritious meals to members of the Grinnell community. The Meal is the result of a merger of the Davis Community Meal, a non-denominational, community-run meal, and our Blessed Community Meal, that was restarted in the Spring of 2023. The Grinnell Community Meal maintains the nonsectarian character of the Davis Community Meal along with its strong network of support from various community groups, and uses the kitchen provided by our church. The weekly meals are not restricted to any religious group, and everyone is welcome. The Meal's main purpose is to be a food resource for food-insecure members of the community; it is also a source of community engagement and fellowship.

Over the past few months, the Grinnell Community Meal has seen a regular attendance of around 45-60 individuals and has attracted a variety of volunteers from GUMC and several other churches,

civic groups, non-profit organizations, and businesses have provided and served the meal. The majority of the meals are prepared in the church's kitchen and the weekly attendance includes 8-15 volunteers

who cook, serve and cleanup. The largest number of attendees are senior citizens. Some are GUMC members, although most are not. Our goals are to serve 80 or more each week, to reach more families with children and involve more community groups in the project. News From Your GUMC Foundation

The Grinnell UMC Foundation is always ready to receive and manage your gifts of cash, stocks, or funds from estates. I would like to share how one such gift was used. In 2011, the Foundation received a gift of \$9,000 from the estate of a member's parents. In 2023, the remaining funds were all spent. Over that 12 year period, we spent a total of \$14,877.92 from the fund generated by the original gift of \$9,000. The following is a list of the things that the gift funded:

\$500 toward a youth group mission trip; \$1,600 toward confirmation camp for kids; \$2,100 toward the TGIW (Thank God It's Wednesday) program, this was an after school program sponsored with the Lutheran Church; \$10,000 was part of GUMC's contribution for the Head Start 2018 remodel; \$402.04 towards course books for adult study groups; \$275.88 toward repair and replacement of bells for the Bell Choirs.

Our church and Foundation are truly thankful of the support from the past and look forward to your continuing support in the future. If you have any questions about the working of the Foundation, please contact Lyle Roudabush or any Foundation Committee members.

Milk Fund and Toilet Paper Donations

Each time we take communion in worship you may notice the small metal boxes at the front and back of the sanctuary. These are a visible reminder of our MICA fund collection, funds that originally went to cover milk and in recent years have expanded to also cover toilet paper. Any family who gets a food box from MICA now gets a gallon of milk or a voucher to Fareway to get a milk substitute (lactose free, soy, etc.). They also get 3 rolls of TP in their food box, essential personal hygiene items that can't be purchased with SNAP (food stamps). Since 2018, the church has paid for delivery of a pallet of TP to MICA from Fareway four or five times every year. If you've never ordered TP by the pallet, it is around 2,016 rolls of TP and costs from \$1200-\$1400. As with everything, this cost has increased significantly over the last few years, at the same time the need has increased. While installation of a cooler at MICA has helped reduce their total milk bill, the demand on the fund to cover toilet paper continues to increase. If you are able, your support of this fund will directly help people in this community. You can give on communion Sunday, or you can add a regular monthly donation to the fund to your EFT by contacting the church office. Since working on this project I find I think a lot more about the blessing of always having enough TP in the house! Thanks for your ongoing support of this important ministry, Monique Shore. page 5

Devotions/Opening Prayer – Scott Sharp - What Is My Net Worth in Christ? Defined by the wonder of his grace - Count your many blessings. Getting to know each other. We shared our favorite thing about Spring growing up. Review/accept previous months minutes. Motion by Scott, second by Connie that minutes be approved as presented.

Pastor Report: Confirmation Overnight went great - 5 Confirmands. On April 28 lots of people will be joining the church and we will have more in June. In preparation for the time he is gone, speakers are lined up, and 2 pastors are on call if needed for a funeral. On April 28 he will be meeting next year's confirmands (probably will be 3 or 4). During his renewal May 6 thru June 2, Eric has a cabin available to stay in.

Administrative committees:

Finance: Jerry Lane - Pledge data April 2024; 91 pledges total, 11 pledges are up to date (12%), 60 pledges are ahead in giving (66%) - an additional \$57,468.00, 20 pledges are behind in giving (22%) - a decrease of \$7,960.00. 60 different pledge cards paid ahead does give Jerry some concern about balancing the EOY, but the unpledged money is significant. **Foundation:** Ramona Mitchell - Foundation met in March. They approved two grant requests: one for the December Dinner theater and one for Senior Bibles. Ramona reported they always review financials at their meetings.

Memorial: Don Burkhead -The Memorial Committee did not meet in March. When more information is available, they will meet to discuss allocating memorial funds for replacement of the speakers in the overflow area and equipment to support moving the bell choir performance to the front of the sanctuary. Hopefully all the Bell Choir Concerts will be in sanctuary this fall. Jerry said they are trying it out this week.

SPRC: Darwin Copeman - SPRC has completed the review of our personnel policy, will begin the review of all the job descriptions this summer and are working to secure worship leaders while pastor Eric is on sabbatical. They also completed the annual ministry appraisal form which is required by the Conference. Pastor Eric provides a self-appraisal in response to the same topics. There was strong response alignment contained in both forms reflecting on great ministerial priority progress. Dar reported that the speakers are lined up for when Pastor Eric is gone: Lora Cline, Jerry Lane, Barb Lease, Bobbye Schubert, and Joel Dressler on youth sunday.

Treasurer: Lyle Roudabush reported he continues to sign checks and we have enough money to cover them all! He is happy that people give pledges from their IRA's or stocks.

Trustees: Gary Porter - Scott German & Gary met with Delphina and are looking at a couple options for a new induction stove top with a convection oven. They would replace a couple stoves now and possibly buy a third one if they work well. There is a possible \$10K grant coming from the Greater Poweshiek Community Foundation and another possible \$2500 coming.

April Church Council Minutes Continued

Gary had lunch with Richard and talked about organs. Gary found out that electric organs for churches are made to sound like a pipe organ. He is trying to find out if we can maintain our air drive organ. Gary is working with Ginny for Earth Day to provide info about our solar panels. The trustees are considering using some insurance money we received from the hail storm to make some cosmetic repairs. Craig Shore has been working on the speaker in the overflow. It is the same type as the one in the sanctuary (approximately \$600).

Program committees:

Connections: Scott Sharp - The are working on the details of the Confirmation breakfast scheduled for May 5 at 9:15am. They are looking forward to serving our 5 Confirmands, their families, and their Faith Friends. Work is also going into providing care packages for finals week for our Grinnell College students who have ties to our congregation. Bobbye is getting the addresses of about one dozen college students. This fall they will get with the committees to discuss the Fall Festival and do repeats of some of last year's events. Discipleship: Andy Hamilton - The Discipleship Committee is supporting the completion of an active year of Christian Education. Upcoming activities are: Take Away Hunger, April 28, Confirmation Sunday May 5, Last Day of Sunday School Celebration May 12, Pentecost and Youth Sunday May 19, Super Church starting June 2, and Vacation Bible School July 24-26.
