Attendees: Ginny Cameron, Andy Hamilton, Ramona Mitchell, Russ Motta, Tim Niswander, Lyle Roudabush, Pastor Eric Schubert, Connie Scurr, Monique Shore, Mindy Tokle, and Carolyn Grosenbach

Devotions and opening prayer - Russ Motta - The Lord is My Rock - He was talking about this with rock climbing buddies and then plane that broke the sound barrier went by when sitting there on rocks.

Getting to Know each other - Favorite thing about Fall

Minutes -There were no corrections so approved as submitted.

Pastor's Report/Comments: Pastor Eric is now working on figuring out how to add 9:15 service. Two bishops, one of them our Bishop Kennetha, are working out way of sharing Illinois Conference; this change is necessary as need to eliminate another bishop for monetary reasons. The first week of Sunday School had 80 youth and adults attending classes.

ADMINISTRATIVE COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Finance: Report submitted by Jerry Lane. Budget: Actual Budget % of Total Revenue \$378,343.35 \$502,316.00 75.32%; Total Expenditures \$364,108.90 \$502.766.00 72.42%; Net Revenue \$ 14,234.45. Beginning budget planning for the 2025 calendar year. Church committee chairs will need to get their committee budget submitted to finance for consideration. Church attendance is increasing and will require some increased expenses. Apportionments will also be increasing for 2025.

Memorial Committee: Report submitted by Don Burkhead. The Memorial Committee met Monday 9/16/2024 and discussed new memorials totaling \$380 and reviewed other memorial funds and status of projects in progress funded by available memorial funds. Memorials received in honor of Raymond Lott are being forwarded to the St. Joseph's Indian School, one of the recipients designated in Raymond's obituary. The Memorial Committee also reviewed the previously established 2024 goals and made no changes: maintain and grow the list of potential memorials; communicate with families: thank you notes and follow-up; continued communication with Trustees, staff, families and other responsible individuals/groups to keep process on track; consider appeals to congregation for additional memorial contributions designated for a specific purpose; develop and maintain list of acquisitions from Memorial Funds for pastor to reference keep memorial fund documentation up to date

Foundation: Ramona reported did not meet this month. Lyle gave financial recap; Foundation Account 2024 figures; most of the investment income is coming from dividend producing stocks; there is no money invested in CD's as can't sustain growth in CD investment. Housing - some money invested in one stock that has now increased 400% this year; went down a lot earlier. We are still waiting for monies to clear estate. Funds are available when need to do something like ovens; probably need dishwasher soon. Last year our churches normal budget covered housing allowance; hopefully can do that again this year - there is fund if needed. Foundation is there to help committees with "new projects" Ramona & Dyle both spoke about this. Investments are held at Edward Jones, Paul & Mark Kolpin, in Grinnell. Three members from Foundation committee meet with them during year; they have suggestions and then committee members make final decision. Have invested in some new stocks suggested by Home Office.

SPRC: Report submitted by Dar Copeman. The SPRC approved the staff compensation increase and shared that info with Finance Committee. The SPRC budget with increase approximately \$20,000 over 2024 which is driven by overall salary raises of 4.5%.

Treasurer: Lyle Roudabush

Trustees: Report submitted. Merle Fiser has refinished the main NE exterior door and will do the East doors next. We are working on updating lighting fixtures in the Nursery, Wesley Room and hallways. Bulbs in the street light on Park Street have been updated. Replacement convection ovens in the kitchen will be delivered September 16th. We plan to ask the 100+ People Who Care for financial help. Alliant Energy has a rebate that may apply to our solar installation. We replaced the water furnace in the Nursery, others are in line to be replaced.

Russ Motta mentioned with monitoring of smoke detectors we need to get someone else involved; right now if issue only Pastor Eric would get contact. New commercial oven is here; cost of \$30,000, waiting to be installed. There are funds in Trustees budget for this. Connie Scurr discussed dishwasher which was probably new back 25 years ago as we got this

in "good deal" and suggested maybe wait to get new one until Grinnell water system shows improvement. Mindy has sent email to Sally as Julie has been talking about tables planning ahead for Christmas Dinner Theater. The custodians have said there are only 13 usable tables - hoping to need 15 tables with amount of tickets sold at Christmas Dinner Theater in previous years.

Church Council Meeting - Cont.

PROGRAM COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Connections: Report submitted by Scott Sharp: Continue to staff the Welcome Center table after both services, The September potluck was attended by approximately 75 persons. The Fall Fun Festival is being organized by members of Worship, Service, Discipleship and Connections Committees. It will be held on Sunday October 13th from 4:00 to 6:00 PM at GUMC. Activities include pumpkin decorating, carnival games, a bounce house, a Puppets of Praise performance, and food in the Friendship Center.

Discipleship: Andy Hamilton talked; said had funky summer; all are experiencing great energy through Cindy's work. We need to start making notes about where successes are: if changes can perpetuate what to do going forward. There was lots of small group formation; how can we have communication with each other? Pastor Eric commented is a need for more long term faith structure. Andy brought to our group a request from someone in committee that wants to get t-shirts printed; he feels this should be explored and not just order some without further discussion and he told committee would bring this idea to Church Council. There was discussion on how to order if/when we get to that point. Mindy asked Andy to discuss again with his committee and back to us. Members of Discipleship Committee with be involved with Fall Festival.

Service: Ginny Cameron ended up getting sick and wanted to express her thanks for assistance from others in church when missionaries visited our church August 28th. Big THANKS to Lyle who picked them up and to others that helped make the evening flow smoothly. Emmanuel & Florence Mefor, are missionaries from Zimbabwe having been there since 2006. They presented a program on the years they served at Mutambara Hospital and also shared where they are now serving at Old Mutare Hospital located near Africa University. There were about 42 in attendance; dessert was served prior to their informative program.

Worship: Tim Niswander reported from meeting tonight that they are reaching out to coordinators asking if they want to continue another year.

UWIF: All Church Circles will be meeting this month.

Lay Leader: Monique Shore reported that the Nominations Committee is talking to someone that might be a Youth representative.

NEW BUSINESS

Church Council Budget for 2025 was reviewed. Pastor Eric said have lost about 150 churches in our Conference They did cut Apportionment monies needed last year to \$57,646; will be \$70,988 for next year. Total Apportionment Budget for church for 2025 will be \$71,148. Motion to approve Church Council 2025 Budget of \$ was made by Russ, seconded by Ramona. Motion carried. Our budget includes Chamber Membership expense of \$150, which is the same as was last year. Mission and Ministry Plan for 2025 discussion. Various comments were shared and Mindy will use information to update and bring back to committee next month. Community Meal program is now going well with collaboration with other groups in community. Pastor Eric expressed concerned with school system and how we can help support local teachers. Many churches statewide including our schools and neighboring schools are finding it hard to get and keep teachers and as well are dealing with declining state funding. One of concerns as church is to support educators in community.

Schub's Sharing

Then Jesus went with his disciples to a place called Gethsemane. He said to the disciples, "Stay here while I go and pray over there." When he took Peter and Zebedee's two sons, he began to feel sad and anxious. Then he said to them, "I'm very sad. It's as if I'm dying. Stay here and keep alert with me." Then he went a short distance farther and fell on his face and prayed, "My Father, if it's possible, take this cup of suffering away from me. However—not what I want but what you want."

He came back to the disciples and found them sleeping. He said to Peter, "Couldn't you stay alert one hour with me? Stay alert and pray so that you won't give in to temptation. The spirit is eager, but the flesh is weak." A second time he went away and prayed, "My Father, if it's not possible that this cup be taken away unless I drink it, then let it be what you want."

Again he came and found them sleeping. Their eyes were heavy with sleep. But he left them and again went and prayed the same words for the third time. Then he came to his disciples and said to them, "Will you sleep and rest all night? Look, the time has come for the Human One to be betrayed into the hands of sinners. Get up. Let's go. Look, here comes my betrayer."

Matthew 26:36-46

We have been talking about having emotions because we are made in the image of God, and we are starting to talk about how we can use our God given emotions for God and God's kingdom. In October we will be talking about worry and anxiety in general, and in our lives as followers of Jesus Christ in what is probably the most contested and divisive election in any of our lives.
